Pentecost & Pizza

We started this initiative last year to help our tamariki celebrate Pentecost. In the Christian Calendar Pentecost also known as Whitsunday, falls 50 days after Easter and finishes the Easter season. Pentecost celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. Red is the liturgical colour for this day. Pizza Recipe

Here's a basic recipe to make Pizza with your tamariki, let them choose their toppings and encourage them to bring another pizza along to share after Karakia (*Manaakitanga*)

Ingredients:

One packet of Lebanese bread
Tomato Paste or Tomato sauce
Shredded bacon or Ham
Red onion sliced thinly
Grated Cheese
Heat oven to 200c

Instructions:

On your oven tray, place one bread, spread a layer of tomato paste, then bacon, then onion, and finally cheese. Cook until cheese is melted golden.

Depending on your children's taste you can add sliced mushrooms, pineapple, olives, etc **Enjoy**
